Whew, what a whirlwind last few months and still playing catch up! Seriously where does the time go? I work hard to get to the point I can travel and then when I get back I am further behind. Don't you hate it when you feel the need to start every e-mail with "sorry for the late response but...". At least I am honest and say I am busy, or forgot to reply or just plain misplaced the e-mail. That's better than blaming it on cyberspace, or found the e-mail in my spam box claim. How lame!! Well, at least everyone uses the same claims to get what is needed, a relief from instant replies in today's hectic world of instant gratification. I know, you got your own issues and don't need to hear my whining, at least my travels usually amount to exciting news and more business for Trek, so I am happy to give you a report.

In early April Cara and I were invited by Lord Jamie Hamilton, son of The Duke and Duchess of Abercorn, to visit their lovely country Estate called Baronscourt in Northern Ireland. Our main purpose was to establish a relationship founded on their excellent driven pheasant hunts taking place each fall on the Estates 5000 acres. Our visit was also enticed by our daughter Stacey's birthday who is currently working a mere 90 minutes from Baronscourt in County Antrim near Northern Ireland's stunning coastline. It would also be Cara and ours first visit to the Emerald Isle and happy to say, not the last!

Trek has plenty of history in Ireland chiefly that we ran lots of these driven hunts from Ashford Castle in The Republic of Ireland during the mid to late 1970's. It was a glorious couples affair with stunning accommodations, loads of history and that great Irish hospitality. Trek founders Bob and Shirley Cloaninger (Irish descent) usually hosted these trips and only relented in later years. Unfortunately Ashford Castle and the rest of Ireland were concerned more with the ongoing conflict between Ireland and Northern Ireland and what is referred to as "The Troubles" and we ceased sending clients there in the 80's. Once things stabilized in the 90's Ashford started

focusing more on mainstream tourists and arranging weddings than driven pheasant hunts and left us a with a big hole in our Irish program until now!

It is hard to discuss touring and hunting in Ireland without acknowledging their long conflict, but rather than delve in this tragic history, I prefer to accentuate the positive things I saw that are now happening and, more quickly than even the most stern advocates realize. Northern Ireland has always existed in the shadows of Great Britain who were the predominant countries of the U.K. and never achieved a level of comfortable acceptance among world travelers or investors. Well this has changed in a big way in the last decade where their general tourism and economy has doubled with much of the credit going to listening and learning from their rival neighbor, The Republic of Ireland. Thanks to some fine whiskey, great golf courses, Game of Thrones, the Titanic and Guinness beer; The Celtic Tiger and Northern Ireland are now considered equal to many other proven countries of the UK and Europe in general.

We were thrilled to have Stacey show us around Antrim and the incredibly beautiful coastline where we crossed the 60-foot long Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge in 40 knot winds 90 feet above the rocky shore (thrilling), and marveled at the amazing hexagonal, balsalt columns of the Giant's Causeway formed by an ancient volcanic eruption. And those castles, my oh my, so many of them and each with their own history and lore. Dunluce Castle for instance has more to do with family feuds and lore than any actual royal ancestry or courageous battles, and some of the stories are pretty intriguing. But one cannot deny the utter beauty of these relics with the backdrop of the Irish Sea and Scotland looming on the horizon.

Lord Hamilton invited us to Baronscourt where we briefly met the Duke and Duchess. Thankfully they both held out their hands to shake relieving us from deciding whether we needed to bow, curtsy or do nothing. Actually both were very nice and looked

the royalty part, if anyone does. The Duchess and her two children are actually in line of succession to the British throne and the Duke is related to the late Princess Diana of Wales. Much is written of them both and needless to say, they are a fascinating couple and could be one of the all time great fireside chats! Jamie gave us a personal tour of the Estate and the first thing we noticed was the incredible paintings hanging from the walls, each from well known artists dating back hundreds of years. That is what I love about Europe, so much retained history and much of it older than the birth of our country.

After our tour of the Estate and conversations with Jamie, it was apparent he and his parents are passionate about the tradition of driven hunting and the relationships that come with it. You can tell from his description of each of the 20 drives they offer and the new ones he has planned. The home while historic and complete with reminders of an age gone by, it is still a home for them most of the year and you can feel that when you are walking through the many rooms. However come October when the first groups arrive, and the pheasant and beaters are readied, the excitement builds again for a tradition that has been ongoing for generations. I think anyone who wishes to experience this trip in such a beautiful place and with such interesting people, will not be disappointed. Cara and I were impressed and can see why our daughter isn't coming home soon and that's okay, it just means we'll see her again in October with some of our clients!!



After an extensive remodel in 2014, the lodge is better than ever and hitting on all cylinders again. Those that missed Sierra Verde for a few years have already started migrating back being welcomed with open arms. With Edgar Quintos at the helm as head guide, you can be assured of great hunting and plenty of laughs. The lodge has eight bedrooms, full spa, swimming pool, and the now signature H&H fire pit. Located only 45 minutes from Cordoba’s airport, Sierra Verde is hard to pass up. As always, we will be happy to organize any amount of hunting days you wish. Most choose from 3 days of hunting for \$2,100/hunter or 4 days of hunting for \$2,700/hunter. This includes lodging, meals, drinks, select wines/liquor, gun rental, hunting license and ground transfers as a group from Cordoba to Sierra Verde round trip. Season is year round.



La Portenita Lodge - Cordoba Argentina

Located just 20 minutes north from Sierra Verde is La Portenita Lodge housing six bedrooms in the main house with an additional three bedrooms in the casita just behind the lodge all recently remodeled. For those wanting to bring a large group of 14+ hunters, La Portenita is ideal with a large great room for entertaining and front porch where evening meals can be taken in the spring and fall months. Of course it would not be an H & H lodge without an in ground fire pit making the Malbec even smoother. The icing on the cake is the views offered from La Portenita as it sits on a hill overlooking the fertile fields that afford the high volume hunting that makes Cordoba unique. Pricing is \$2,100/hunter for a 3 day hunt and \$2,700/hunter for a 4 day hunt. We will be happy to tailor any number of hunting days you wish at La Portenita. Rio Seco Lodge – Cordoba Argentina

This is a smaller, quainter lodge with six bedrooms, large common area, fire pit, massage room and located about two hours from Cordoba airport. A working cattle farm comprising some 5,000 acres, Rio Seco opened in 1998 but recently underwent a full remodel. The appeal of Rio Seco is a family or small, close group can have the entire lodge as it only take 6 hunters to secure the lodge exclusively. Drives are normally short and close to one of the largest dove roost in the world. With Rio Seco as another option for Trek hunters, this allows a tremendous amount of flexibility for booking your next Cordoba adventure. Choose between a 3 day or 4 day hunt at \$2,100/hunter or \$2,700/hunter (respectively) or you may wish to customize your trip which we will be happy to arrange. White-Wingers at La Finca Lodge

Trek Safaris has wrapped up our second consecutive season in San Fernando, Mexico with more great success hunting dove, duck and quail at La Finca Lodge. As the White-wing season in Mexico approaches, we here at Trek cannot be more excited to start sending clients to this target rich environment again. With populations of white wing on the rise in the San Fernando area, sportsmen are staying close to home to target these challenging birds. Enjoy very consistent shooting while you have doves dipping and darting in all directions as white wings naturally do. On a typical hunt you can expect to shoot about 12-15 boxes per hunt with a mid-day break back at the lodge to relax and some pool time. The best part is that its literally at our back door and we believe that is one of the reasons Outfitter Steve McCain has been seeing The La Finca lodge at full occupancy group after group. With this amount of success, people are flocking to San Fernando to get in on the action. Trip after trip satisfied clients leave Mexico with smiles on their face knowing that they are going to rebook before they even cross back over the border.

Nicaragua Duck/Dove

Blue Winged Teal Shooting in a Wild, Tropical Setting.

Just over two hours from Miami you are smack in the middle of some of the best teal hunting in the world. The season opens in late October and last year's numbers confirm that we are on a record setting pace for the 2017-2018 season. Still excellent February dates available, call today.



The Hunting: Imagine sitting comfortably in a lush, tropical lagoon as the Papagayo winds are gently tugging at your back, when a flock of teal come zipping into your decoys against the backdrop of the smoking San Cristobal volcano. This scene is played out every day from November to February in Nicaragua, home to one the largest concentrations of wintering blue winged teal in Central America. Literally thousands and thousands of these fast flying ducks call Nicaragua home through late February, or as long as the water holds. Add in some challenging white winged and mourning doves and you have the makings of a nice mixed bagged hunt in warm tropical climes. You will also have the opportunity to take pintails, spoonbills and widgeons.

The Trip: Your adventure begins upon arrival in to Managua, Nicaragua. Groups are met at the airport by your hosts, Richard Townsend, or staff and taken as a group by air- conditioned vans straight to the Hotel Farallones or Hotel Portales in Chinandega, about a two-hour drive on newly paved highway. The following three days are full hunting days. We will shoot both mornings and afternoons, returning to the hotel for lunch and a siesta in the middle of the day. Usually we'll hunt ducks in the mornings and dove in the afternoons depending on game concentration and time of year, but the guide will make that determination at the time. Early season we can customize your trip to include as many ducks hunts as you wish and price accordingly.

The Accommodations: The Hotels Farallones and Portales feature single room accommodations with hot water, AC, cable TV, WiFi, and large swimming pool with outdoor BBQ setting. All meals will be taken in the restaurant and lounge.

2017-2018 Season Trip fee: \$ 3,350.00 per person. Fee excludes airfare, but is to include three days of shooting with three duck hunts and three dove shoots, single room accommodations with meals at Hotel Farallones, or Hotel Portales, hunting licenses, permits and transfers.



The Luck of The Irish

Trek has recently contracted with the famous Baronscourt Estate in Northern Ireland for a line of eight guns on October 9-13, 2017 to hunt both pheasant and partridge. This is a very rare opportunity and one we are pleased to offer our clients.



Overview: Baronscourt is home to the Duke and Duchess of Abercorn, aside from their bloodlines and very interesting history (she-in line of succession to throne and he-relative of the late Princess Diana), they along with their son Lord Jamie Hamilton are wonderful hosts to a handful of groups during the fall hunting season in the beautiful countryside of County Tyrone. Their Georgian Home was constructed in the mid- 1800's and adorned with original paintings of Royalty from the 14th Century onwards. Recently it has been renovated with new furnishings and artifacts depicting the style for which it was originated, albeit with modern appliances and technology. This is truly a family home with eight bedrooms, extensive library, game rooms, living room, informal and formal dining areas and various other beautiful common area spaces.

The Hunt: The Estate consists of 5000 acres featuring some 20 different drives for Ringed-neck pheasant. Each drive is distinct from one

another and affords guns with very challenging opportunities. Usually we shoot 3-4 drives per day with a break for snack. Baronscourt meticulously hatches and raises their own pheasants making sure only the more vigilant fliers are introduced to the ancient woods surrounding the property. Some hunting stands are located near three lakes in the Baronscourt Valley, making truly a dramatic and unique backdrop for driven hunts.

Details: Our line of shooters will have two back to back days of 300 pheasant hunts at Baronscourt followed by a 350-bag driven partridge shoot at the Cleggan Estate near Antrim. While the hunt at Cleggan has only been available since 2000, they have achieved a remarkable reputation. Typically there are six drives in a day at Cleggan.

Add on: In addition to this incredible shoot, we can also arrange a wonderful tour of the Irish coast and countryside to include stays at the infamous Ashford and Dromolind Castles where couples are

more than welcomed. Reaching Baronscourt is easy with daily flights into Dublin and Belfast followed by a private 2-hour transfer. We must stress again that this is an extremely rare opportunity to not only hunt this wonderful Estate, but to also be hosted by the Duke and Duchess who make their home yours for the hunting season.

Price- £10,995 per hunter... Price includes two days of 300 pheasant presented to a line of 8 guns at Baronscourt Estate, one day of 350 partridge hunting at Cleggan Estate, four night's accommodations with all gourmet meals, beverages and alcohol that is to include some fine wines from the Duke's cellar! Welcome to the Jungle, We Got Fun and Game

Bolivia is one of the best places in the world for incredible high volume dove shooting, tremendous service, great food and first-rate lodging and from August-October, add in the Cano Negro Lodge for peacock bass and you have hit the mother load.

Shooting 1000 shells a day is common in Bolivia but when you can combine it with literally catching 100 peacock bass a day, this Cast and Blast is truly out of this world! Not only will you catch a lot of ferocious peacocks but will also have shots at the toothy Payara, Pacu, Oscars, Piranhas not to mention several varieties of Amazon catfish! The Caño Negro lodge is located in the middle of the jungle, close to the Brazilian border in the area known as the Beni, truly the land that time forgot.

The Trip: Is a nine-day, eight-night adventure with three days of fishing and three days of great dove shooting with at least one morning of pigeons thrown in to boot. Although international airfare is not included in the trip fee, the preferred schedule is the overnight flight to Santa Cruz, out of Miami, on American Airlines. Upon arrival, you will

be met by one of our agents to assist the group through customs and gun clearance before taking the group directly to the domestic charter airport for private charter to the fishing lodge, about a two and a half hour flight from Santa Cruz. Once you arrive you will have lunch and after getting settled in, head out to fish the rest of the afternoon. The following two days are full fishing days. On day five, after fishing the a.m., you will charter back down to the hunting lodge, have lunch and head out for the rest of the afternoons dove hunting. The next two days will be full hunting days. You will shoot the last morning before having lunch and returning to Santa Cruz for the evening. Next day you will have an early morning six hour non-stop flight back to the States

The Shooting: Is extraordinary as the sky is literally darkened by doves pouring out of their roosts in the mornings and back in the afternoons. With these first class lodges, we are sure you will have a great trip.

The Fishing: Is excellent for peacock bass from 3-10 pounds, Payara, and numerous other Amazonian species. Whatever your choice, bait casting, spinning or on the fly, your experienced guide will have you in the right spot. If the conditions are right you should easily catch from 60 to well over 100 fish per day per person.

The Accommodations: Las Palomas is a first class lodge with single occupancy, air conditioned rooms and swimming pool. Caño Negro lodge has four air conditioned bungalows with double occupancy.

Trip Fee: \$ 5,495.00 per person for 3 days of fishing and 3 days of dove shooting. Fee is based on groups of 4.

Description: Fee excludes international airfare, gun entry fees, Bolivian Visa and final night in Santa Cruz, but is to include private charter flight to and from the fishing lodge...all lodge accommodations including meals and bar.

A \$ 1,500.00 per person, non refundable deposit is required to confirm your reservation.

US Citizens must have a travel Visa to enter Bolivia. Trek will provide you the necessary paperwork and you will just get the Visa upon arrival into Santa Cruz. Currently \$ 160.00 USD for a 10 year Visa.

Trek partner Jorge Molina, his family and staff have worked tirelessly over the past 15 + years to maintain their position as the premier dove shooting operators in Bolivia. From the original Las Palomas Lodge to the premier Los Guaduales Lodge, they have provided the traveling adventurer the perfect option for any pocketbook. The beauty of these operations is that you are assured the same personal service no matter which lodge you choose.



The Trip: Although airfare is not included in these programs, the best way to get to Bolivia is on American Airlines who offer daily flights to Santa Cruz out of Miami. Currently the itinerary is for an overnight flight to Santa Cruz, via La Paz, Bolivia. When you arrive into Santa Cruz you will be met by a member of Jorge's staff who will assist you through customs and then provide the 90 minute ground transfer to your preferred lodge. After a relaxing lunch and getting settled in, your group will head out to shoot this afternoon. The next two, or three days will be full shooting days. The following day you will shoot the morning, before having lunch and being transferred back to Santa Cruz where you will spend this final night. The last morning, you will be met at the hotel and be transferred to the airport for your morning departure, arriving back into Miami late afternoon.

The Lodges: With 12 single rooms, Las Palomas offers the ultimate in privacy and comfort while still maintaining the lodge "feel" that the Molina's have always been known for. By the end of your visit, you will feel like part of the family. The newly constructed Los Guaduales Lodge is the culmination of all of the items Jorge wishes he would have constructed on his first lodge. By that I mean that this 20,000 square foot beauty offers 10 spacious single rooms as well as a Master Suite for the group leader. The well appointed bar sits amidst a massive dining area and activity center. To sooth those tired muscles, you can take advantage of the full spa with Jacuzzi, wet and dry sauna, steam room and even a full time masseuse. This lodge literally has it all.

Check Out Those Red Legs

Trek Safaris has reserved one of the best dates of the season at Estancia Pinos Altos in Spain for fantastic Red-Legged Partridge shooting. Pinos Altos is legendary for their hunting program catering to Americans and has been Trek's destination of choice for 14 years running.



The Trip: After your arrival and gun clearance in Madrid, most prefer to spend a night in this great city before getting to Pinos Altos. The next day you will be transferred by Pinos Altos staff to the hacienda located two hours south of Madrid near Ciudad Real. Pinos Altos is a restored 16th century home set in the famed La Mancha region. It sits in the middle of 10,000 acres where Red and Fallow Deer and Mouflon Sheep roam. After a nice welcome dinner, hunters will receive instructions for the next three days shooting and non-hunters will devise their plans for tours and shopping. The last involves a transfer back to Madrid and your flight home.

The Accommodations: Pinos Altos is a restored 16th century estate that has been Part of the Saiz family for hundreds of years and is used as their personal vacation home and hunting lodge. This 10,000-acre estate is a perfect place to host a group of hunters looking for an expertly organized driven hunt yet sophisticated enough to bring their wives. There are 14 expertly appointed bedrooms with private baths, two living rooms, impressive dining room, and a terrace that overlooks the property as herds of red stag and fallow deer move in the distance.

Evenings are a treat as we dine on gourmet meals served family style and accompanied by the ever-present Rioja wines and delightful conversation.

The Hunting: Each hunting day starts with an 8:30 AM breakfast and then set out for the shoot. Most shooting areas are within a 20 -minute drive where you will draw pegs for driven hunt. Each day will consist of 4-5 drives depending on shooting conditions and consists of an allotted total of 600 partridge for the line of eight guns. You'll have two drives in the morning followed by a delicious field snack and then two more drives followed by a huge elegant lunch. Each hunter has their own loader and a secretary to carry your shells, shotguns, set up your blind, etc. A line of beaters- generally 40-50, will push the partridge over the shooters at their assigned pegs set about 15-30 yards down the crest of a hill. The birds will come flying fast and quick over the hill and the shooting is fast and furious. A good shot can expect to spend three to four shells per partridge. There's time for a shower and some rest before dinner. These are special affairs with traditional meals and an elegance depicting an era gone by, yet still here. Other Activities: Among the non-shooting activities will be a trip to Toledo, and

visits to nearby typical haciendas, small villages and historical points. You may also choose to go shopping for leather goods, porcelain, ceramics, pottery and local wines.

TRIP FEE: \$14,500 per hunter and \$1,400 for the non-hunter, based on double occupancy. The trip fees are based on a line minimum of eight guns and 600 birds a day.

The Fishing: The black water rivers of Brazil's Amazon are home to over 2,500 species of fish, the most famous of which is the hard fighting Peacock Bass. These powerful fighters are extremely aggressive producing devastating top water and subsurface action unlike any other freshwater fish in the world. You know you're fishing for a bruiser when the guide hands you medium-heavy action rod & reel spooled with 80 lb test braided line and a 6" top water lure with several 4/0 treble hooks hanging from it! Trek is offering a chance to set the hook while fishing either 4 or 6 full days. We'll be fishing exclusive & private waters designated for only the Cabin anglers that have allowed us to manage the amount of fishing pressure on a given area greatly enhancing the numbers and quality of Peacock Bass available to anglers. You will wake up each morning at 5:30 am for breakfast and then leave for the day's fishing

with an experienced native guide in one of our custom built 20' all welded aluminum bass boats, returning around 5:00 pm for a dip in the river or a shower, hors d'oeuvres and dinner at 7:00 pm. You can then spend some time enjoying the sounds of the rainforest and telling stories about the day's adventure.

The Bases are Covered at Grand Slam Lodge

It is no secret that from Mexico's Yucatan all the way to the southern end of Belize, Permit cruise endless flats just waiting to make even the greatest fly anglers look foolish. While it is always exciting taking shot after shot at these fish, praying for a hook-up, not so much is coming back to some half rate lodge each afternoon, eating crummy food and sleeping in an uncomfortable bed. This seems to be the norm through this part of Central America, but not on Trek's watch as we have a much more desirable option.

Grand Slam Fly Fishing Lodge is located in the sleepy town of Punta Allen, the Permit capital of the world. There are several other fishing lodges within a half hour from Grand Slam, but none of them are at this level in terms of accommodations as GSL offers six beautiful oceanfront villas with king sized Bali beds, 42 inch flat screen satellite TV's, IPOD docking stations, Jacuzzi's, overlook and beachside balconies with hammocks. The lodge also features a large swimming pool and separate restaurant and lounge offering a blackboard menu of the best dishes from around the world. Unlike some of the other lodges, GSL has 24-hour electricity and no loud generators. And oh yea, that ever popular Wi-Fi access!

Not to take its name for granted, Grand Slam Lodge holds true each year, as many anglers are successful in completing the "Grand Slam" catching a Permit, bonefish and tarpon during one day of fishing. The lodge sits in the Sian Ka'an Biosphere, which also encompasses Ascension Bay and the surrounding lagoons that are teeming with fish. Not an avid fly fisherman, no worries as you can spin fish for these flats species or head out just a short boat ride from the lodge to drop lines on the Mesoamerican Barrier Reef catching snapper, grouper and barracuda.

If you have been looking for a place to take your significant other where you enjoy a Caribbean vacation and get in some great fishing as well, then Grand Slam will do nicely. It's a 3 ½ hour trip south of Cancun Airport that is served by most all major airlines from many major cities around the world. From June through September, you can enjoy an incredible special where two anglers travel at the single occupancy rate. Choose between 3 days of fishing (\$1,720/angler), 4 days of fishing (\$2,105/angler) or 5 days of fishing (\$2,485/angler) not including airfare.



Cuba

Trek Knows Cuba

Well it has been two years now since we first promoted Cuba and it seems like an eternity. I won't lie, Cuba is a lot of work and takes loads of attention, but I will say the programs there have evolved, as has the island as a whole. When we first started there was little to no internet and cellular service was limited to major cities. Now you can find internet access in most all major hotels, some restaurants and a few defined areas. To travel there legally you needed to be part of a group with a valid pre-condition to be there, now there are agencies like Trek offering programs fitting under 12 new general-license categories. Gone are the charter flights and now every major US carrier has a flight to Cuba.



Our initial program into "The Pearl" involved a two nights stay with tours in Havana and three days fishing on the Zapata Peninsula. It is still our most popular program and while the background in Cuba is still very much communist, most people have enjoyed the visit and interactions with its people. The fishing areas in Zapata like the rest of the island is controlled by the government and leased as a concession to whomever bids the highest. Fortunately our suppliers are young, patient and creative because that's what it takes to be successful in Cuba.

Our 3-4 night tour-only programs in Cuba have done extremely well and offer the kind of value Trek is known for and is sensitive to the changing times in Havana. More restaurants, hotels and services are now available and we are adding them to the programs. No one has better bi-lingual guides than Trek and returning guests re-enforce this time and time again. We are also available to customize these programs should you be more interested in architecture, history, museums, manufacturing, farming, cultural, etc.



In the very near future you will see new fishing programs involving large-mouth bass and expansive new flats areas using new boats that will produce unheard of angling. So too we will offer trips to the wild where the snook action borders on the insane. My favorite is a trip where we will take 4-6 anglers on a 10-day voyage across central and western Cuba allowing not only pristine fishing opportunities but also a chance to interact with the real Cuban culture, one that is not touched by Havana or today's modern offerings. We are getting more creative in Cuba and invite you to do the same. Stay tuned my friends.

Three years ago it was opening the deluxe Los Guadales Lodge and last year purchasing fifty new Benelli shotguns adding to an already incredible inventory. For this season, his son Jorge Jr. stepped up to the plate opening his own craft brewery. This is not a hobby type brewery like the ones you may think about ordering online. This is a full on, production brewery with several beers already brewed and kegged ready to consume.



Sir Pieper Brewery originated from Jr.'s love of what else, beer. He honed his “craft” during his college years in the US working summers in Colorado and New England. Learning from some of the most respected Brew Masters in the industry, Jr. graduated college, took his new found brewing skills back to Bolivia and joined the family outfitting business. Several years later, here we are with his vision now reality. Early this year, Sir Pieper Brewery was completed and sitting only a few hundred yards from Los Guadales & Las Palomas, groups seem to enjoy the uniqueness of having a cold draft in the tasting room toasting an unbelievable hunt.



The Sir Pieper lineup consists of five flavors; Jacob Blessed (Red Ale), Nubia (Golden Ale), Honey Bear (Honey Ale), Accidental Stout (Dark Stout) and Dirty 8 (IPA). Each has its own unique flavor and Jr. will be happy to tell you the story behind everyone while sampling. The next step for Sir Pieper is to start bottling and distributing to bars & restaurants in San Cruz and later La Paz. Much like the US, the craft beer craze has exploded in South American countries like Argentina, Colombia and Chile, but is still slowly evolving in Bolivia. With the opening of Sir Pieper Brewery, Jorge Molina Jr. will



be single handedly bringing Bolivia to the forefront of the craft beer scene. The sky is literally the limit for Sir Pieper's growth and with Jorge Jr.'s inherited ambition and drive; we have a great taste of the future.



Tanzania is an East African country known for its vast wilderness areas, including the plains of Serengeti National Park, a safari mecca populated by the “big five” game (elephant, lion, leopard, buffalo, rhino), and Kilimanjaro National Park, home to Africa’s highest mountain. Offshore lie the tropical islands of Zanzibar, with Arabic influences, and Mafia, with a marine park home to whale sharks and coral reefs.

Zanzibar is a Tanzanian archipelago off the coast of East Africa. On its main island, Unguja, familiarly called Zanzibar, is Stone Town, a historic trade center with Swahili and Islamic influences. Its winding lanes present minarets, carved doorways and 19th-century landmarks such as the House of Wonders, a former sultan’s palace.
